Overview

LeadingAge Illinois, in partnership with the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), MatrixCare, and Polsinelli, is pleased to announce a workshop for Illinois Assisted Living operators, directors, and managers: Illinois Assisted Living Manager's Bootcamp 2.0. The curriculum has been designed to address the rising acuity of residents, alternative payment models, and the legal challenges facing providers.

The IDPH team will provide an in-depth review of the Assisted Living Code, specifically focusing on the care planning process, documentation, and staff training requirements along with the Department's expectations for achieving regulatory compliance. Ample time will be allotted for participant questions.

Denise Wassenaar, RN, MS, LNHA, will address the importance of creating nursing competencies, including the necessary leadership skills for working with direct care workers and handling of smooth transitions in care, as resident acuity increases in Assisted Living. She will also explore alternative payment models along with the importance of Quality Improvement in Assisted Living.

Polsinelli attorney Meredith Duncan will explore issues of medical marijuana use in senior living in addition to examining how to handle third-party caregivers, including their contracts and policies. She will discuss the forces impacting legal and regulatory compliance through case studies and offer practical guidance and best practices to navigate these challenges.

Objectives

At the conclusion of this educational offering, participants will be able to:

- Thoroughly understand the Illinois Assisted Living and Shared Housing Act, with particular focus on the care planning and staff training requirements
- Identify core elements of a clinical competency validation program
- Examine alternative payment models for Assisted Living and the importance of having a strong Quality Improvement Program
- Understand the legal concerns impacting Assisted Living with third party caregivers and the expanding use of medical marijuana in senior living
